This programme aims to provide registered nurses with the necessary in-depth, evidence-based knowledge, skills and competencies to deliver safe, quality care to highly dependent children and young people as they live with complex life-limiting illness and/or face the end-of-life.

RESPONDING TO THE NEEDS OF THE IRISH HEALTH SERVICE

In 2015, it was estimated that there were 3,840 children in Ireland living with complex life-limiting conditions (Ling et al 2015). Children who have complex care requirements or reach the end-of-life deserve the very highest standard care, provided by specialised paediatric palliative or complex care nurses. Unfortunately, it is acknowledged that in Ireland today there is an absence of staff who demonstrate the very specific and special skills to work in this demanding field of nursing practice.

JOIN A COLLABORATIVE PROGRAMME

This curriculum has been developed in conjunction with the School of Nursing and Midwifery, National University of Ireland, Galway and the School of Nursing and Midwifery University College Dublin (UCD). The evidence-based, innovative curriculum has been created in partnership with national and international experts, parents and stakeholders in children's palliative / complex care.

You will develop your clinical skills and build relationships with mentors / experts within the specialty by completing clinical placement in a children's palliative care / complex setting.
